

Program 10: MAJOR EXHIBITION FUNDING

FUNDING POLICIES AND GUIDELINES 2008-2009

1. Read the CKCA *Arts, Culture and Heritage Funding Programs* brochure for a general overview of all CKCA funding programs available.
2. Read the *How to-Funding Policies and Guidelines* for general policies applicable to CKCA funding programs before starting your application to ensure eligibility.
3. Major Exhibition Funding program applications are adjudicated by the CKCA Steering Committee and should be ***sent directly to the CKCA. Applications must be received by the CKCA by 5:00 pm PDT on Friday, April 4, 2008. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. Fax or E-mail applications will not be accepted.***
4. The Major Exhibition Funding program has two categories:
 - 10a-Major Exhibition - Arts***
 - 10b-Major Exhibition - Heritage***
5. The intent of the ***10a-Major Exhibition - Arts*** program is to provide an opportunity for cultural organizations or venues in the Canadian Columbia Basin to create a professionally juried or curated major NEW exhibition of a Canadian Columbia Basin artist or artists. The funding is intended to support the coordination, programming and promotion of such an exhibition. The exhibition may include a touring component, either inside or outside of the Canadian Columbia Basin.
6. The intent of the ***10a-Major Exhibition - Heritage*** program is to provide an opportunity for heritage and cultural organizations or venues in the Canadian Columbia Basin to create a professionally curated major NEW heritage exhibition. The funding is intended to support the coordination, programming and promotion of such an exhibition. The exhibition may include a touring component, either inside or outside of the Canadian Columbia Basin.
7. As a priority of the CKCA, when original artwork is being exhibited, professional fees must be paid to the artist(s), at a minimum of CARFAC rates (<http://www.carfac.ca/>).
8. After reviewing the Major Exhibition Funding application materials it is strongly recommended that you discuss the nature of your project idea and funding request with CKCA staff ***well in advance*** of the application deadline.
9. Applicants should demonstrate the ability to successfully complete the project as proposed.
10. It is strongly recommended that Major Exhibition Funding application budgets exhibit other sources of revenue in addition to the CKCA funding request.
11. The funding is designed to support NEW initiatives and is not available for capital, regular operating or existing deficits.
12. In general, the aim of the CKCA Major Exhibition fund is to meet community rather than private sector needs. Any proposals submitted by private sector organizations must be sponsored by a non-profit community organization and must clearly demonstrate community benefits.
13. Funding under Program 10 is not available for the purchase of Capital equipment (a piece of equipment with lasting benefit beyond the project, which costs over \$200.00). If this type of equipment is required to complete the project, the equipment may be rented to complete the project, and the rental fee may be listed as an expense.
14. Major Exhibition Funding is available up to \$11,000.00 per project. Total program funding for 10a is \$11,000.00. Total program funding for 10b is \$11,000.00.
15. Program 10 projects must take place after May 31, 2008 and must be completed by April 30, 2010.
